A Word From Coach Fano

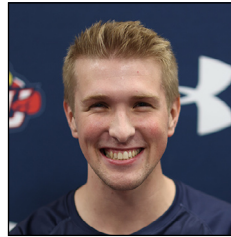
BRUCE LOCKWOOD JR.:
